GRADE 12 HIGH SCHOOL MARKS

An asterisk shown against a mark or grade indicates that it is an interim rather than a final mark or grade.

SYSTEMS OF GRADING

From 1946 to August 1967, inclusive, the percentage system of grading was in use at the University of Manitoba. During this period grades were described as follows: 80% to 100% was considered equivalent to an 'A' grade (first class honours); 67% to 79% a 'B' grade (second class honours) and 50% to 66% a 'C' grade (passing). Several faculties required a minimum average of 60% to proceed to the next year in a program, and Music and Pharmacy required a minimum grade of 60% in professional courses.

Previous numerical grades for students in the system were converted to letter grades for the purpose of calculating a cumulative grade point average in the following manner:

50% to 66% was converted to a "C" grade
67% to 79% was converted to a "B" grade
80% to 100% was converted to an "A" grade

Letter grading commenced in January 1968. The 'B+' grade, however, was not introduced until the 1969 Summer Session. The Faculty of Medicine reports one overall result for each session on a pass/fail basis.

All faculties with the exception of Graduate Studies, Law, Nursing and Social Work require a 'C' (2.0) weighted grade point average for graduation.

Nursing and Social Work require a weighted grade point average of 2.5 for graduation.

Graduate Studies requires a weighted grade point average of 3.0 for graduation.

Effective May 1981 eligibility to proceed in the Law program ceased to depend on a weighted grade point average which, therefore, is no longer printed.

COURSE WEIGHTING

In Arts, Science, Social Work, Management, Agriculture, Human Ecology (effective March 1981-previously Home Economics) and Physical Education, a full course is equivalent to 6 hours of credit and a half course, 3 hours of credit. In these Faculties and Schools, one hour of credit is approximately the equivalent of 1 lecture hour or two laboratory hours weekly throughout the Regular Session of 26 weeks. In other Faculties and Schools, no uniform relationship exists between hours of credit and course weighting.

It is suggested that a full course taken for the entire academic session involving 3 hours of lectures weekly for 26 weeks be regarded as equivalent to 6 semester hours or nine quarter hours.

Prior to 1946, a unit was the measurement used for course weighting. One unit was equivalent to 1 hour of lectures or 1 laboratory period (of 2 or 3 hours) per week throughout the Regular Session of 26 weeks.

In the above Faculties and Schools, a unit is equivalent to approximately two semester hours. Four units are equivalent to 6 hours of credit.
