HARVIE: One further matter and that is the Winnipeg Child and Family Services versus Samantha Kematch 4 5 and Steve Sinclair. 6 THE CLERK: That should be number 38. 7 THE COURT: Number 38? 8 MR. HARVIE: I beg your pardon, yes. Anishinaabe 9 Child and Family Services has been served with petition, Your Honour. I'm instructed to seek particulars 10 11 at this time. 12 MS. BOWMAN: I can advise that the parents and the social worker are just outside, so we're fetching them. 13 I believe this is a matter where the agency is seeking a 14 three month temporary order and Mr. Orobko, I'm sure, can 15 16 confirm that. 17 Present in court is Andrew Orobko, the supervisor of the CFS unit. And with him, I'm assuming, are the 18 19 parents. 20 MS. KEMATCH: Yes. 21 MR. SINCLAIR: Yes. 22 MS. BOWMAN: Okay. Perhaps we can ask Mr. Orobko 23 to present the plan and we can determine the parents' 24 positions. 25 MR. OROBKO: Morning, Your Honour.

MR. OROBKO: We have Mr. Steven Sinclair, the biological father of the child, Phoenix, present, as is the mother, Ms. Samantha Kematch.

THE COURT: Morning.

At this point in time, Your Honour, the agency would ask that a three month temporary order of guardianship be granted with respect to the child, Phoenix.

During those three months, the agency is asking that Ms. Kematch attend and complete a psychological assessment.

- 1 The assessor to be mutually agreed upon between the agency 2 and Ms. Kematch.
- During that time, we are also asking that both parents attend the parenting program and once again, that would be a program mutually agreed upon between the two parties.
- And finally, during that three months, we are asking that the parents ensure they attend all visits with the child, Phoenix, to, to ensure that some form of bonding can, can ensure.
- The agency is committed towards working the child home as quickly as possible and with parental cooperation and if they attend to those three things, we think we can achieve that goal.
- THE COURT: And where is Phoenix placed during the, this time and what, what's the proposed placement if the agency obtains the order?
- MR. OROBKO: Yes, child is currently in a, an agency emergency shelter. Ideally, we would like to have the child in an emergency foster home, but at this time it is in the shelter. And certainly, at this point, regular visitation has been set up. I believe it's two hours on a weekly basis at this point. We would strive to increase that visitation as we get closer to a return date.
- THE COURT: All right. All right. If the parents could come forward to the microphone please.
 Morning. If each of you could state your full names so we have it on the court record please?
- 29 MR. SINCLAIR: Steve Sinclair.
- 30 MS. KEMATCH: Samantha Kematch.
- 31 THE COURT: And you're the parents of Phoenix?
- MR. SINCLAIR: Yes.
- 33 THE COURT: And you understand at this time the 34 agency is seeking a three month temporary order of

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1 guardianship and Mr. Orobko has outlined to the court this 2 morning what the plan of the agency is if they obtain that 3 order? 4 MS. KEMATCH: Yes. 5 THE COURT: And you're aware of that, you're 6 aware of your right to seek legal advice if you disagree 7 with the agency application? 8 MS. KEMATCH: Yes. 9 And what is your position? THE COURT: 10 wishing to agree with the agency application, or --11 MS. KEMATCH: Yeah, we agree to the three month 12 temporary order --13 THE COURT: All right. 14 MS. KEMATCH: -- and to go to parenting classes and (inaudible) see a psychiatrist or psychologist and 15 16 visitation (inaudible). 17 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. 18 Mr. Harvie, you're seeking an adjournment --19 MR. HARVIE: Well --20 THE COURT: -- or --21 MR. HARVIE: -- in, in the circumstances, I don't 22 think we need to hold up the order. My concern, however, 23 Your Honour, is that program standards indicate that when a 24 native child is apprehended and indeed, when a application is filed before the court, there's an obligation for the, 25 26 for Winnipeg Child and Family Services to consult with the native child caring agency in an interest, in the interest 27 28 of any foster placement being in accordance with program 29 standards and the, the authority of Mr. Justice Goodman in 30 this regard in the D.A.M. decision of last summer. 31 The concern, on behalf of my clients would be 32 that they were provided with a letter dated April the 28th, 33 advising them of the apprehension, with information to
